Job 37 – With Him, have you spread out the skies, strong as a cast metal **mirror**?

Isaiah 40 – The grass withers, the **flower** fades, but the word of the our God stands forever.

Genesis 31 – So Jacob took a **stone** and set it up *as* a pillar.

Proverbs 26 – The lazy *man* buries his hand in the **bowl**; It wearies him to bring it back to his mouth.

Matthew 10 – And whoever gives one of these little ones only a **cup** of cold *water* in the name of a disciple, assuredly, I say to you, he shall by no means lose his reward.”

Jeremiah 52 – They also took away the pots, the shovels, the trimmers, the bowls, the **spoons**, and all the bronze utensils with which the *priests* ministered.

Malachi 3 – “But who can endure the day of His coming? And who can stand when He appears? For He *is* like a refiner’s fire And like launderers’ **soap**.

Isaiah 64 – But we are all like an unclean *thing*, And all our righteousnesses *are* like filthy **rags**; We all fade as a leaf, And our iniquities, like the wind, Have taken us away.

Daniel 3 – So at that time, when all the people heard the sound of the horn, **flute**, harp, *and* lyre, in symphony with all kinds of music, all the people, nations, and languages fell down *and* worshiped the gold image which King Nebuchadnezzar had set up.

Ezekiel 40 – He took me there, and behold, *there was* a man whose appearance *was* like the appearance of bronze. He had a line of flax and a **measuring rod** in his hand, and he stood in the gateway.
